Frequently Asked Questions

May only Catholics or Scouts earn this? Who may earn this activity patch?

Any youth or adult may earn any of the activity patches. The requirements are grade-specific.

Is this activity considered a Religious Emblem and may a Scout receive a religious knot after completing this activity?

No. This activity is considered a Religious Activity, not a Religious Emblem program. Scouts may not receive a religious knot for earning this activity patch.

Will there be more Saint Activity Patches?

Yes. There may be additional Saint patches released, from time to time.

Who may serve as an adult mentor for this activity?

Any parent or adult who meets the standard BSA and diocesan safe environment requirements.

Is there any time requirement?

Only that the grade-specific requirements need to be completed while in the respective grade level.


Do the answers need to be submitted?

American Saint Series Activities

The American Saint Series honors men and women who led heroic lives of faith that have greatly influenced American Catholics. Their words, their deeds, and their devotion to prayer and the sacraments, inspire all American Catholics. Some of these men and women are canonized as "Saints" and are venerated by the Universal Church. Some are beatified as "Blessed" and are venerated by the Local Church. Some are honored as "Venerable" and, while on the way to becoming a "Saint", may be venerated by Catholics. Most of these men and women lived and worked in North America in what is now the United States. Some others never set foot in America, however they had a huge impact on the Catholic American landscape. All of them sought to follow Jesus.

Requirements for Saint George Activity Patch

1st thru 5th Grades - Complete 3 requirements and 2 activities.

6th thru 12th Grades - Complete 4 requirements and 3 activities.

Requirements:

- 1) Where and when was St. George born?
- 2) When is the feast day of this saint?
- 3) St. George is considered the Patron Saint of?
- 4) What is St. George known for (major accomplishment)?
- 5) St. George is probably best known for the legend of St. George and the Dragon. Legends attempt to tell the truth about a person by using larger-than-life details. What was this legend all about and what similarities does it have to St. George's real life?

Activities:

- 1) Draw a picture showing some of St. George's actual accomplishments. Introduce others to St. George by telling the story and sharing this picture with your family and friends.
- 2) Identify the next Religious Emblem of Faith that you can earn as a Scout and meet with your Scout leader or parent/guardian and start working on this next program.
- 3) Create signs and posters that get people to ask themselves how they can be a better Christian. Place these in your school or church.
- 4) Perform an examination of conscience. What would you do if you saw someone being bullied? How might you imitate St. George?

Requirements for Adults:

- 1) Assist the youth with this American Saint Activity.
- 2) Share your thoughts with the youth about this American Saint.
- 3) Review the responses to the requirements of each youth participant to confirm their accuracy and to ensure hi/hers understanding.
- 4) Complete the order form for this American Saint Activity and submit it with payment for the patch to NCCS.
